2025-2027 Pole Vault Event Group Plan

All event group's objectives are guided by the overarching statement of '*Australia versus the Rest of the World*', the fundamental purpose of the panels is to:

- Bring together event group coaches/experts to discuss ways to enhance the "Spirit of the Event Group".
- Establish a Three-Year Event Group Plan which will include items such as a calendar of camps/workshops/initiatives aimed at upskilling emerging and established coaches and enhancing the overarching "Spirit of the Event Group"; and
- Identify and implement initiatives that will enhance Australia's capability to achieve sustainable success (i.e. by achieving Medal and Top 8 performances) at Major Championships by the 2032 Brisbane OGs and beyond.

The pole vault event group's plan, aims to achieve these objectives by:

1. Increasing the **participation** in the event around Australia. There are many athletes with the potential to become international pole-vaulters that never have the opportunity to vault.
2. Providing opportunities for existing pole vaulters and coaches to **collaborate**. With the purpose of providing opportunities for athlete and coach development along a high-performance pathway.
3. **Up- skilling** existing pole vault coaches. To provide quality event specific information to coaches on all aspects of high-performance pole vault.
4. **Recruit new coaches** and establishing more pole vault clubs across the country. A key objective will be to increase the number of accredited pole vault coaches operating in all states of Australia in order to provide opportunities for more athletes to pole vault.
5. **Reducing the impediments** to pole vaulting:
 - Assist multi- event athletes.
 - Age group rules.
 - Equipment information and assistance.

The pole vault event group's performance indicators:

1. Pole vaulters competing from every state and territory at the Australian All Schools and/or the National Underage Championships from 2025 onwards.
2. More athletes vaulting in the under 14 age groups at the Australian All Schools and/or the National Underage Championships.
3. Full team of pole vaulters (2 female and 2 male) qualify for each World Under 20 Championship from 2026 onward.
4. Full team of vaulters (2 female and 2 male) qualify for each World University Games from 2027 onwards.
5. Full team of vaulters (3 female and 3 male) qualify for the World Championships & Olympic Games from 2030 onwards.

Event group recommendations (note this is an advisory group)

1. Where possible provide input/consultation into the event grid for major domestic competitions.

2. Decathlon to replace heptathlon for boys under 15 & 16 at state and national championships, with support to help athletes to learn to pole vault, and with an appropriate lead time. Currently under 15 & 16 boys do a heptathlon that does not include pole vault.
3. No lower age limit on pole vaulting competitions. Competent vaulters of any age should be allowed to compete in the current under 14 categories. There is no need to introduce any younger age group categories for pole vault – just allow younger athletes to compete in the existing under 14 age group.

2025 Event Group Initiatives

January 25	Collaboration Pole vault camp conducted at the AIS 3 to 7 January. This camp was for vaulters (and their coaches) who are age eligible and have performances that indicate they can represent Australia at the World University Games. 12 vaulters and nine coaches attended.
April 25	Up-skill coaches Conduct coach/vaulters education session at the National Championships in Perth. Howard Arbuthnot is presenting on the Reno Pole Vault Summit and Mark Stewart on running for pole vault and horizontal jumps.
May 25	Collaboration This camp is aimed at vaulters (and their coaches) who are age eligible and have performances that indicate they can represent Australia at the 2026 World Under 20 Championships.
December 25	Up-skill coaches Coach education session(s) at the Australian All Schools in December.
Ongoing	Reduce impediments to pole vaulting: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Participation, devise methods of allowing young talented athletes to be introduced to the event. That is, the coaches design their own processes (dates, times venues etc..) – then we can enlist Athletics Australia and the state associations to publicize these opportunities. 2. Panel members identify and support others to become involved in coaching – either by joining their own pole vault group/club or encouraging them to establish their own groups. 3. Collaboration on equipment, with borrowing/lending, buying/selling and swapping of poles.

2024:

- The PV panel advised AA competitions about the problem with rules associated with the introduction of the new under 13 age group at the national championships this year. The rules had the unforeseen consequence that 12-year-olds would not have been allowed to compete in under 14 pole vault. On the advice of the panel the rule was changed. There were similar problems for walks, TJ & HT, and now these rules were also changed.

2023:

- Kurtis Marschall & Nina Kennedy spent time with young athletes at the Australia All Schools in December. The idea of the session was for Kurtis and Nina to talk about the opportunities pole vault had provided them and compare this to what would likely have happened had they kept going with the events they started in track and field – in the end this session became more of a meet and greet.
- Question and Answer session with Kurtis Marschall & Nina Kennedy and eleven pole vault coaches from around Australia. This was also done at Australian All Schools in December 2023.

2022:

- Two pole vault camps were conducted in Perth in June and July, with elite open and under 20 years of age vaulters and their personal coaches.
